All Selectmen Present

Brian Turnbull was in to give the Selectmen an application for current use. The Selectmen reviewed and approved the application.

Dan Currier was in to talk to the Selectmen about cutting some trees behind his house so he has a better view of the river. He was told to make sure he did not cut trees on other people's property without their permission. He does not need to get an intent to cut as it is all scrub lumber which will be left where it is dropped.

Todd Landry was in to get the ball rolling on having the State Police patrolling the town. The State has covered West Stewartstown for 2 years now and it is going well. They will be doing four hour shifts in the town of Monroe. Todd Landry will be setting up the schedule and the Selectmen will not have a copy of it. They will bill us on a monthly basis. They will also do a report for us at the end of the year for the Town Report.

Carl Johnson was in to let the Selectmen know that he is now chairman of the School Board. He said they are ready to start working on the alarm system and wanted to know how to get the money from the Buffum Funds. The Selectmen said that all bills have to come to them for approval and then to the Trustees to pay. Carl also said that the School Board has signed a contract with Tom Maguire for three years as Superintendent and Principle.

The Selectmen looked at the Current Use application for Richard Adam and decided that the Assessor would have to look at the property before approving it. They also looked at applications for Loxley Ness and Gerry Ramback, more paper work is needed before they can be approved.

The Selectmen discussed Cemetery Lots. Bruce Frazer made a motion that a person has to live in the town of Monroe for five years before they can receive a free plot for 2. The motion was seconded by Bob Wormer. All in favor, motion passed.
